We started with some light grading and mowing. There is good access from Alamo Dr. with plenty of room for parking and trailer turnarounds. The Owners Association contributed the cement pad, which has been poured, and a picnic table and trash can that will be installed in the next few weeks.

We had a tremendous work day recently with a large group of people trimming trees to make the pond shoreline accessible, hauling brush and dead wood, and picking up garbage. Our local 4-H group has promised assistance with emptying the trash cans as needed and some weeding along the dam. The Master Gardner's will be planting daffodil bulbs along the face of the dam soon after the rain softens the dirt. The park will be still another trailhead to further access our system of trails and easements throughout the subdivision. We will be applying for another grant from Tractor Supply/STEP program to further improve access to the park and trail system in the near future. It has been wonderful to see so many people join together on this project that will enhance and add value to our community.

We have had some beautiful fall weather in the past few weeks. This is an ideal time to get out for a hike. The air is cooler and most of our summertime insects and reptiles have gone into hiding for the winter. So take some time to get outdoors and enjoy our trails.
